* In an addendum, the administration suggests providing an additional \$2 billion stemming from the bipartisan budget agreement to avoid rent increases on elderly and disabled families in FY19, restore 200,000 vouchers, and provide support to insolvent public housing authorities, although it is unclear that Congress will allocate funding to do so.
