Meet Mikayla Murphree, 2015 Recipient of the Jack Godin, Jr. Scholarship and 2023 Recipient of the CARH Scholarship for Graduate Students

Mikayla Murphree describes her childhood in Mount Hope, Alabama as a struggle due to improper housing and food insecurity in spite of her mother working non-stop. She was an excellent student who always knew she wanted to go to college and become a doctor, but was unsure how to make that happen. She knew that getting good grades was the first step.

When she was 15, Mikayla's mother was able to secure an apartment for the family at Stonecrest Apartments in Russellville, Alabama, managed by CARH member, Irby Management. For the first time in her life, they had an appropriate and safe place to live. Mikayla's mother could focus on other things to help her two daughters even more. Mikayla and her sister, Courtney, could invite friends over for the first time. They could both put even more effort into their schoolwork with the security and peace of mind their new home provided. After achieving a 4.4 GPA in high school and being named Valedictorian of her senior class in 2015, Mikayla was awarded several scholarships. But they didn't cover all of her expenses at Mississippi State University. She credits the Alabama CARH and the National CARH Scholarships with making up the difference she needed to cover all of her college costs. Mikayla earned her B.S. in Microbiology in 2019. She went on to graduate school with the CARH Scholarship, again providing critical funding and earned her Ph.D. in Biomedical Sciences at the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Medicine in May 2024.

Today Dr. Murphree works as a Pulminary Pathophysiologist at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus in Denver, Colorado. She specializes in cystic fibrosis (CF) and works in the lab discovering new treatments for patients living with the incurable disease that affects over 40,000 people in the United States and over 100,000 worldwide. Therapies that Mikayla discovers help to improve and extend the lives of CF patients. Thirty years ago, people with CF only lived to be in their 20's. Today, the median life expectancy is in their 60's.

Mikayla's goal in life was always to make the world a better place. She is perfectly positioned to do that every day. She says the CARH Scholarships put her there, giving her the freedom to chase her dreams and become the doctor she always wanted to be. According to Mikayla, "CARH changed my life."

The CARH Scholarship Foundation awards scholarships annually to exceptional students residing in rural affordable housing across the United States. The foundation was created in 2005 to promote education and expand opportunities for residents of CARH-member properties. It has grown from awarding two scholarships in 2006 to seven scholarships in 2023. Originally open to applicants for undergraduate education, the scholarships are now open to non-traditional applicants, trade/vocational applicants, and graduate school applicants.

The first two scholarships were named in honor of James L. Poehlman of T&C Associates of Middleton, WI, and Gordon L. Blackwell of GLB Associates of Raleigh, NC. Mr. Poehlman was a founding member of CARH, a board member, Chair of the Owner and Development Committee, Co-Chair for the Aging Portfolio Committee, an Advisory Trustee, and 1998 Member of the Year, before his death in 2004. Mr. Blackwell was a longtime CARH member and former board member. He was also the founder, President, and Chairman of the Regency Housing Group, the largest developer of affordable rental apartments in the United States in 2001. He died in 2006.

The foundation honored Jack Godin, Jr. at his death in 2010 by naming a third scholarship in his memory. Mr. Godin was a founding CARH member and past president, and Vice President of the Southern Development Company, which built, managed, and owned hundreds of affordable housing complexes in rural and urban areas throughout Alabama. The CRHD Founders Scholarship was added in 2013, honoring the founders of the Council for Rural Housing and Development, the precursor to CARH. The fifth scholarship is named the CARH Scholarship Foundation Scholarship and was added in 2015. The sixth scholarship was added in 2020 and honors the Council for Affordable and Rural Housing. In 2023, a seventh scholarship was added and is named in honor of Charyl K. Luth a former co-chair of CARH's State Affiliated Association Committee and long-time Executive Director of the Affordable Housing Association of Indiana.
